Dear Director Baker:

This letter addresses the South Carolina Department of Health and Human Services' (SCDHHS') submission dated June 16,2020 in response to the Office of Special Education Programs' (OSEP's) required actions under the fiscal section of OSEP's differentiated monitoring and support (DMS) report dated August 29, 2019.

OSEP's Differentiated Monitoring and Support (DMS) report, required SCDHHS to submit:

- 1. Policies and procedures that are reasonably designed to ensure the accuracy of SCDHHS' payments to its early intervention service or EIS providers. Those policies and procedures must include a review of EIS provider claims for early intervention services and ensure that EIS providers are not submitting multiple claims or receiving duplicate payments. A review of the policies and procedures must also examine Managed Care Organization (MCO) practices to ensure that their relationship with EIS providers does not negatively impact the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act's (IDEA's) payor of last resort requirement in 34 C.F.R. § 303.510 or the requirement to serve traditionally underserved groups (including rural populations) in 34 C.F.R. § 303.227; and
- 2. Documentation supporting the implementation of those policies and procedures, including training on SCDHHS' updated procedures and processes, and examples of reports generated through SCDHHS' general supervision oversight responsibilities.

Upon reviewing the State's submission, OSEP has determined that SCDHHS has provided all the required information, and no further action is needed specific to the required actions listed above. OSEP notes that, pursuant to the State's designation as a "high risk" grantee, as outlined in the Specific Conditions to South Carolina's IDEA Part C Federal fiscal year (FFY) 2020 grant award, a robust fiscal monitoring system should be part of the full implementation of SCDHHS' general supervision responsibilities, including monitoring to timely identify and correct noncompliance as required by IDEA sections 635(a)(10) and 640 and 34 C.F.R. §§ 303.120, 303.501 (monitoring), inclusive of SCDHHS' fiscal oversight responsibilities. We would be happy to offer any technical assistance appropriate in achieving this goal.

OSEP appreciates the cooperation and assistance provided by your State staff in addressing the fiscal requirements related to Part C of the IDEA.
