will depend on such factors as the number of students exercising a choice option or receiving supplemental educational services and the costs of satisfying these requests. An LEA has discretion to determine the allocation of these funds between choice-related transportation and supplemental educational services, except that it must spend at least one-quarter of the 20-percent reservation - or an amount equal to 5 percent of its Title I, Part A allocation - on each activity if there is demand for both from students and their parents. State educational agencies are required to post actual information on the 20-percent reservation and the per-pupil amount on their websites based on the final LEA allocations they determine. Note that the Secretary is inviting waivers to allow LEAs to exclude Title I, Part A ARRA funds when calculating the set-aside for choice-related transportation and supplemental educational services and determining the per-pupil amount for supplemental educational services. ^{***} An LEA that must arrange for supplemental educational services is required to pay, for each child receiving services, the lesser of the actual cost of the services or an amount equal to the LEA's Title I, Part A allocation received from the State divided by the number of poor students in the LEA, as determined by estimates produced by the US Bureau of the Census. Thus the amount shown in this column reflects the statutory "cap" on per-child expenditures for supplemental educational services.
