A mentally challenged person owing student loans she can never benefit from but.....

My daughter had a mental breakdown (schizophrenia) her third year of college. Since that time she has struggled to keep her mental balance. But that hasn't stopped the student loan industry from harassing us and her relentlessly. Her debt of \$10,000 is now up to \$60,000 and the money we owed (Plus loans of \$15,000) is now almost \$80,000. After my daughter became ill, my husband and I have struggled yearly to keep a roof over our heads. No one will help us... the company that calls us is insulting and rude even though my husband is out of work and I suffered a mental breakdown dealing with my child and have fibromyalgia so I don't work steady. We have been told that the only way to get the loans off is for my daughter (and this is for her direct student loans) is for her to declare she will never be well again. And even though one of her doctors was willing to sign to this affect, our daughter refuses to acknowledge she is sick (something that happens to schizophrenics) and so we are stuck. We are distressed.
