Westwood College provides the following written comments as a supplement to oral comments made by Westwood College officials at the Denver—home of Westwood's main campus and Central Administrative offices—and Philadelphia negotiated rulemaking public hearings. In these written comments, Westwood College supplements the oral comments it made on the compensation structure for admissions representatives, one of the issues raised in the Department's Notice of Proposed Rulemaking.

Westwood College is an institution of higher learning committed to operating with integrity. The College has implemented an admissions compensation plan in compliance with the 2002 "safe harbor" rules adopted by the Department. While certainly not perfect, "safe harbor" rules do provide some guidance to schools in developing, implementing, and administering a compliant admissions compensation plan. The Department will create greater uncertainty should it eliminate the "safe harbors," as some have advocated, without the corresponding implementation of new rules that provide even greater guidance and clarity than the existing rules.

Westwood College is eager to abide by whatever rules the Department promulgates, and it requests that the Department develop clear, concise, comprehensive, and consistent guidance in its formulation of any new rules governing admissions compensation. Any changes in the rules should, of course, be based on facts and evidence of existing admissions practices, rather than on dated concerns, assumptions, speculation, and innuendo or isolated instances of alleged misconduct.
