To whom it may concern,

From July 1998 to July 2001, I attended Katherin Gibb's School in Montclair, NJ. I reported to the Dept. of Education that my school was guilty of fraud, that it faked the grades of its students to hide the fact that their were no instructors, classes or supplies. I submitted my own letter, a diary of my time in the school, letters from other students to support my claim, and a petition from over 50 students.
